Notice for Bridge Bids.

Sealed bids are invited for the construction of a 100 foot span Howe-Truss bridge, resting upon concrete piers, together with 64 feet of approach, across Butte creek on the boundary line between the counties of Marion and Clackamas, State of Oregon, at what is known as the Jack bridge, one mile southwest of Marquam, Oregon. Plans and specifications will be on file at the offices of the county judges of Marion and Clackamas Counties, on and after June 15th, 1907.

Bids will be opened on Friday, July 5th, 1907, in the county court room at 1 o'clock p. m., at Salem, Oregon.

Each bidder will be required to deposit a certified check for the amount of 5 per cent of his bid, which shall be forfeited to the counties of Marion and Clackamas in case the award is made to him, if he fails, neglects, or refuses, for the period of two days after such award is made, to enter into a contract and file his bond in the manner required by, and to the satisfaction of the above named county courts upon the day appointed.

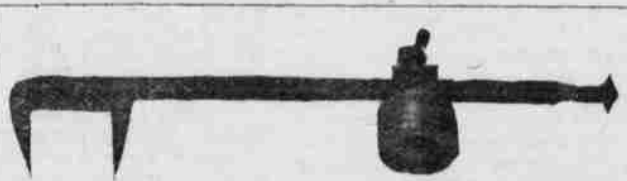
