BRADLEY SLATED TO GO.
Report Has It That John Green Will Be Street Superintendent.

Victories and defeats are soon forgotten and the talk among those politically inclined is now turning towards the appointments of Dr. W. E. Carll, mayor-elect. The medicine man is clam-like and is not shouting his intentions from the housetops, but it is whispered that several important changes will be made. It is regarded as certain that Superintendent of Streets John C. Bradley will be succeeded by John Green, who was street superintendent before the regime of Mayor Caulfield. Mr. Green pulled off his coat and worked for the election of Dr. W. E. Carll and he is not likely to go unrewarded, 'tis said.

It is reported that a shake up will occur in the police department, but this is not generally credited, for the work of the present officials is generally acceptable and they took no part against the mayor-elect in the campaign that is just past.

The appointments of Dr. Carll embrace a chief of police, two night policemen, city engineer and superintendent of streets. The fortunate men will be announced at the first meeting of the city council in January.
