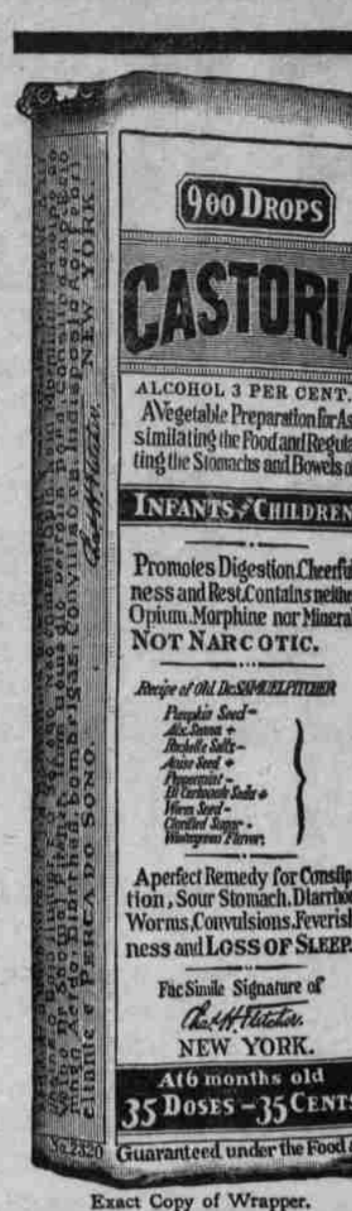

Sues for Damages. Suit has been filed in the circuit court by Dr. E. A.
