ORDINANCE NO.—
An ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 406, approved Sept. 14th, 1907, entitled "An Ordinance to prevent the obstruction of Streets."
Oregon City does ordain as follows: That Section 4 of Ordinance No. 406, approved Sept. 14th, 1907, entitled "An Ordinance to prevent the obstruction of streets, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:
Sec. 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$25.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding fifteen days. Provided that each day that any hitching-post or hitching-racks is maintained contrary to the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed a separate offense. And further may be punished by fine. And provided further, that the City Council may direct and empower

the Street Commissioner or other officer, to remove such hitching-posts or racks, or other device maintained contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, and the cost of such removal shall be a lien against the property opposite which such hitching post or rack is attempted to be maintained.
