William Anderson, Well-Known Farmer of Redland, is Injured by Horse.

William Anderson, who resides near Redland, was last week kicked by a fractious horse on the right arm, crushing the bone near the elbow, and severing the main artery. Mr. Anderson was brought to Oregon City immediately, where Dr. Strickland dressed the wound, and on Wednesday morning was taken to the North Pacific Sanitarium, Portland, where an operation was performed on the arm by Dr. Coffey, of Portland. Word was received here Thursday morning of the death of Mr. Anderson from blood poisoning. Deceased was 49 years of age and leaves a widow and two children. Funeral services will take place from the Methodist church in this city Friday.
