The need of such an organization is apparent from the unsatisfactory progress so far made in the use of de Conservative, Strong, Safe, natured alcohol and its production by the farmers themselves. The cost of the distilling apparatus and the necessary requirements of its manufacture to be fulfilled have deterred them from investing in the business of making alcohol. It has met with strong opposition, of course, from other manufacturers of liquid fuel, and every month that its general use can be de layed means millions to the monopoly. that it threatens. Much can be done by the discussion of this question as to its use, manufacture, etc., in subordinate granges.
