Ordinance No. —
An ordinance to prohibit free lunch in saloons where intoxicating liquors are sold.
Oregon City does ordain as follows:
Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person, to whom a retail liquor license has been granted, to maintain or permit to be maintained any sideboard or lunch counter with lunch or food thereon from which patrons may help themselves, in or upon any premises used as, or connected with the use of a saloon in which intoxicating liquors are sold.
Section 2: Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum, not less than five dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars for each offense, and each day that any such sideboard or lunch counter is maintained shall be deemed a separate offense.
