ORDINANCE NO.—An ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder to purchase additional ground for cemetery purposes. Oregon City does ordain as follows: The Mayor and Recorder are hereby authorized to purchase the following described property from M. M. McGeehan: A part of the D. L. C. of Wm. Holmes and wife in T. 3 S., R. 2 E. of the Willamette Meridian, described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at an iron pipe set at the southeast corner of Mountain View Addition to Oregon City, the same being the Northwest corner of a tract of land conveyed to M. M. McGeehan by E. P. Carter and wife by deed, recorded on page 355 of book 32 Records of Deeds for Clackamas County, and running thence South 1544.8 feet to an iron pipe at the Southwest corner of the said McGeehan tract, thence North 62 degrees 10 minutes East 260 feet to a stone monument, thence North 247.5 feet to a stone monument, thence East 410 feet to a stone monument, thence North 12 degrees 20 minutes West 874.4 feet to a stone monument, thence East 203 feet to a stone monument, thence South 64 degrees 40 minutes East 35.10 feet to a stone monument, thence North 0 degrees 5 minutes West 123 feet to a stone monument, thence South 89 degrees 13 minutes West 469.30 feet to a stone monument, at the Southwest corner of the City Cemetery, thence North 8 degrees 29 minutes West tracing the West line of the said City Cemetery 223 feet to a stone monument, thence North 89 degrees 39 minutes West 183.5 feet to the place of beginning, containing 15.00 acres; at a price of six thousand dollars, and to issue warrants on the Cemetery fund for the payment of the same.
