Just how much food is in storage in and around Chicago there is no means of ascertaining. Only the wholesalers know, and they will not tell. A few days ago one firm controlling 33 warehouses admitted it had in storage 44,000,000 pounds of butter that must be disposed of before May 1 at the latest.
