



Secretary of the Interior Lane took advantage of the presence of the Blackfeet Indians in New York, where they came to attend the Trave and Vacation show as guests of Louis W. Hill, chairman of the Board of Directors of Great Northern Railway. He sent Mr. O'Hara on to New York, from Washington, to begin his labori-ous task with these Indians. During the stay of the red men in New York, Mr. O'Hara had them sing into phonographs and the records will be sent on to Washington to be put in the government archives, therefore preserving for all time the music of
