

Groups of convicts lounged about or lay sick and incapacitated on the verandas At night the barred fron door of each dormitory is locked, and out side paces a guard, revolver in hand Sometimes under cover of darkness the inmates settle feuds. Occasionally to establish leaders rival gangs fight with cudgels, knives and even paving stones Some disabled, others dead, the most indomitable are reconciled and form a

tyrannical secret society. Many a poor wretch dreads the night hours, and one suspected of in forming may be set upon by an enraged pack. Occasionally murder is committed in profound slience, and daylight finds a dead or dying convict in the passageway or entrance. Questioning is useless, and few guards will risk life in entering the barracks when smothered cries and cursings warn them of internal strife.



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


