Personal property, such as cash, household furniture, and evidences of debt, are totally exempt from taxation.

The Houston plan of taxation contemplates that merchandise, machinery of manufacturies and all other improvements upon land shall be assessed at only twenty-five per cent of their value. Land being assessed at its

Under this plan there is little inrounding industry to make valuableit is not an investment. Under it the minute any man improves a piece of land, be it a vacant lot or a logged off tract, his taxes do not increase If he builds a house on a building lot he is not assessed because of the improvement. If he builds a factory that gives employment to labor, he is not taxed out of the city. If a farmer clears a field, plants an orchard and builds a home, he doesn't pay any more taxes than his neighbor who holds a dead piece of land for speculation, or in other words, the dead land must pay as much taxes as the producing land.
