We have come to a realization of the fact that most men when they

pass their words intend to abide by Gradually the world is discarding the old, cumbrous, outworn formulas by which men and women asseverated, with solemn repetition, their intentions to tell "the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth." The simple giving of the word is

enough. Men and women trust one another. Especially is this true in the treatment of offenders against society. In former decades the idea that one could rely on the word of a convict would have seemed fantastic, ridiculous. The prisoner was a wild beast, to be treated as such, locked up in a cage and not on any account to be trusted. Only after a long course of good conduct could he come to be regarded as a "trusty" and be charged with the commission of favored work in the prison, always, of course, under the watchful eye of an armed keeper.

Nowadays this is changed. The offender against the laws, unless there be reason for suspecting him of intention to commit further crimes, is treated like a man. His word is taken. And the results are good. An advocate of the newer, better,

more enlightened system says: "All the new honor prisons demonstrate that the old fashioned equipment of steel for prisons is a needless expense. The convict's promise not to run away is more effective than steel bars."

Not long ago seme convicts were working at roadmaking in Colorado They were trusted by the state and were miles away from any keeper. The thought of running away, of "going back on their words," never entered their minds. A stranger came to watch the men at work, and he laid his coat by the side of the road. From the pocket protruded a wallet, evidently well filled.

It was as safe as though in a safety deposit vault. One of the convicts picked up the coat and handed it to his foreman, saying: "Here, take care of this cont. Some crook might come along and steal it."

He was on his honor, you see. S are we all on our honor, to do right in the best light of our consciences.
