News that County Seat has no Chief of Police Draws Crooks

Deputy Sheriff E. C. Hackett, acting mayor of the county seat, new as his own chief of police the first three days of the year, not caring to appoint a chief until he could do so before the pomp and ceremony of a council gathering. Portland papers, appraised of this fact by local correspondents, printed the story that the mayor would be his own chief, and crooks read it with interest. Sunday, when Mr. Hackett was acting as chief but was not on the street, burglars visited the county seat and entered the stores of W. Harris and A. B. Buckles. In the Harris store the men pried open the till but found only a few pennies, and after mousing up the general stock a little, they departed. At the Buckles store the crooks helped themselves to cigars, cigarettes and candy—making it evident that the Buckles robbery was the handiwork of local youths of somewhat twisted morals. The night patrolmen received reports of the robberies when they went on duty, but found only footprints in the snow.
