MAKE FINAL DRIVE FOR SALE OF LIBERTY BONDS

At the weekly luncheon of the Live Wires of the Commercial Club Tuesday the final drive to sell Liberty bonds was inaugurated. It is estimated that \$150,000 worth of the bonds have already been subscribed in Clackamas county and an effort will be made to pass the \$200,000 mark. L. Adams, proprietor of Adams' department store, who has taken an active interest in Red Cross work and is a member of committees to raise Red Cross funds and promote the sale of Liberty bonds, subscribed for \$2,500 worth of the bonds Saturday. Dr. M. C. Strickland also applied for \$2,500 worth of the bonds. The Crown-Willamette Paper Company has announced that it will finance the purchase of \$10,000 worth of the bonds to be turned over to employees who wish to buy them. The company will give each employee the privilege of buying two bonds at \$50 each, ten per cent of the purchase price to be paid at the time of the purchase or deducted from the first week's pay check and the balance at 10 per cent per month. Three and a half per cent interest is to be charged on deferred payments, thus giving the employee the bonds at cost for the first year.
