

Household accounts on a familymade budget, replacing the old wifeallowance system, are first-aids in promoting the health, education, pleasures and savings of the family, explained Miss A. Grace Johnson, professor of house administration, to the college press bulletin man.

"The housewife should not be given an allowance," she asserted. "It tends either to niggardliness or wastefulness. If too small supplies will be bought on credit, and if toe large it will generally be spent anyway for fear it may be reduced next
