The city fathers of West Linn, met in regular session on Wednesday night last week. The Willamette sewer proposition was discussed and a motion was made and carried to investigate and carry out provisions included in the petition which was put

before the council last fall. Bids on the Bolton sewer were opened and read and the contract was given to Parker and Schram of Port land, whose bid was over six hundred dollars below the nearest competitor. This firm agreed also to employ local help wherever possible.

Councilman Pickens reported that he has procured an acre tract in the lava beds west of town to be used as a garbage dump and action was taken to provide for a road into this location.

These cars which will be the most modern type of automobile cars will be equipped with double-swing end doors having 10 feet clear opening. According to McCormick the Southern Pacific now has 2197 automobile cars in use on its Pacific System and the new order will be the largest ever placed by a western railroad for this class of equipment.
