**RECEIPES**

**Layer Cake**

2 eggs, ¼ cup sugar, 6 tablespoons Mazola or Wesson Oil, 2-3 cup cold water a little salt, 1½ cups flour 2 teaspoons baking powder.

Beat the eggs and sugar with a dozer beater until thick and light. Vanilla. Add the oil and water and stir well. Add dry materials which have been previously sifted together. Bake in two layers, the pans being greased with the oil. Bake in a bath-

er slow oven.  
**Frothing**  
 1 cup sugar, 1-3 cup boiling water. Boil until it threads well. Pour slowly over beaten white of egg. When thick add juice of an orange and beat again.  
**Boiled Salad Dressing**  
 1 cup vinegar, 1-3 cup brown sugar, 2 eggs well beaten, 2 tablespoons corn starch 1 tablespoon mustard, dash of Paprika. Boil until thick in double boiler and thin with cream when wanted for use.

**SALMON SEASON ON IN EARNEST**

Many Big Ones Registered for Salmon Club Prize

Salmon are running again and the lure of the rod and line has called many fishermen to the haunts of the big game fish. Those who know the game are not having much difficulty in bringing in the limit, three in one day, and even the neophyte is having fair luck.

Dewey Krueger of Farr Bros. made the record catch of the season so far last Sunday in the Clackamas river

when he landed a salmon weighing exactly 48½ pounds, on light tackle such as has been specified by the Oregon City Salmon Club. This fish will be entered in the official contest staged this year by the club. Several large fish have been caught. L. A. King of the Oregon City High School faculty has registered three button fish, Irving Rau one and Mark Sturgis one.

Twenty one prizes, totaling over one hundred and fifty dollars worth of merchandise have been offered by local and Portland merchants for the twenty-one best fish caught on light tackle by members of the club this year. In addition to these prizes

Jack Hermon of Portland, president of the Salmon Club of Oregon has offered a silver cup to be awarded the fisherman catching the largest number of button fish, two years in succession on light tackle. The cup remains in the possession of the angler during the year of the catch. The prizes are on exhibition at Burmeister & Andresens.

Strict regulations governing the use of tackle in the contest have been passed by the club. There, outlined by R. R. Friedrich, secretary of the club, are:

Any line may be used which tests 24 or less when new.  
 Rod to be made of any material, except solid bamboo cane, to be not shorter than five feet over all, and to weigh not more than seven ounces.

"The leader shall not be more than thirty-six inches in length. Reel and spoon to be unrestricted.  
 "Anglers competing for membership or prizes must submit their tackle for inspection to one of the Weighing Committee when catch is weighed.  
 "Anglers must bring fish to gaff un-

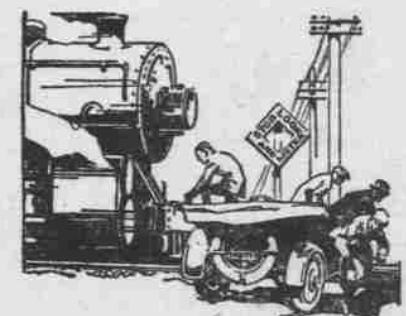
