Pursuant to an order of the County Court of Clackamas County, dated June 17, 1922, notice is hereby given inviting bids for the construction of roads and parts of roads, as follows:

Road "A", Bonding Act Road District No. 7:
Beginning at a point where the Molalla Road intersects the South boundary of the City of Oregon City, Sec. 5 T. 3 S. R. 2 E.; thence along the present Molalla Road to a point where it crosses the line between Sections 5

and 8, T. 3 S. R. 2 E., a distance of approximately 2100 feet.

Road "B", Bonding Act Road District No. 8:
Beginning at a point on Road No. 535 at top of hill at N. E. corner of Lizzie Telford Tract of Land; thence southerly and southwesterly along the present traveled road to a point where it crosses Sec. line between Secs. 11 and 12, T. 3 S. R. 1 E.

Road "C", Bonding Act Road District No. 8:
Beginning at a point where road No. 290 crosses the south boundary of the City of Oregon City; thence southerly and southwesterly on Road No. 290 and 41, a distance of 1422 feet.

A part of Road "A", Bonding Act Road District No. 9:
