Report of viewers of the Brown road filed. Expense account \$26.60, allowed, and Jacob Wiley, Isaac Miller and Joseph Graham, appointed viewers of damages to meet at Fred Schwartz's on 18th day of May...

Report of viewers filed in matter of the Bradley and Richey road, and expense account of \$46.20 allowed. Road ordered opened and established.

Report of viewers of the Ringo and Howard mill road filed and expense account of \$43.30 allowed. Report approved.

In the matter of the grading of the Moss Hill road, the following bids were received; the figures denoting the amount of cents per yard:
Pat Colbert—earth, 2 1/2, loose rock 55, hard pan, 37.

E. Parker—earth 15, solid rock 95, hard pan, 20.
Hannelon & Hays—earth, 18, cement gravel, 30, loose rock 75, hard pan, 35.

Hiram Straight and T. M. Cross—earth, 10, rock \$1.50, hard pan 50.
Contract to be awarded to E. Parker on his filing a bond in double the amount of the contract, to be completed by the first day of July, 1891.

In the matter of grading Oakley Hill, the following bids were received; Jacob Kneek—\$495.
Pat Colbert—earth 2 1/2, loose rock 55, hard pan 37.

Contract will be awarded to Jacob Kneek on his filing a bond in double the amount of the work to be done, contract to be completed by the 1st day of August, 1891, and if he fails to give bonds within the time required by law, the contract will be awarded to Wm. Knight on his filing the requisite bonds, to either case to be approved by the county clerk.

In the matter of the petition of the Portland water commission for right of way over county roads in Clackamas county, the petition was granted on condition that the pipes be laid so as to cause no obstruction to travel.

The petition of J. W. Cochran and others for a trestle from the foot of hill to Butte creek bridge was denied.

It was ordered that Commissioner Mochlun be intrusted to examine the Eagle creek bridge, and if necessary repair the same.

Maxwell Ranney, road supervisor, was authorized to procure powder not to exceed the value of \$20.

In the matter of the application of road supervisor of district No. 17, was denied, as the district had been supplied heretofore.

In the matter of the petition of Reuben Daniels for a right of way of the Truss-Fuller road, T. Fullon was denied, as no reason was given why such survey was asked.

Reuben Daniels, road supervisor of district No. 40, was authorized to procure the necessary material and repair a certain bridge in this district.

It was ordered that the clerk be instructed to cancel warrants Nos. 7513 and 7514, which were drawn through mistake.

The resignation of John Rowan as road supervisor of district No. 17, was accepted, and W. L. Houscomb appointed.

County Alliance

Organized by Prof. M. V. Rork Saturday.
Pursuant to call the delegates from the various alliances in Clackamas county met at the court house, May 9, 1891, to organize a county alliance.

Prof. M. V. Rork called the meeting to order and W. S. Runyan was elected temporary secretary. Charles Moran and W. W. Myers were appointed a committee on credentials, and reported the following entitled to seats from their respective alliances:

Canby—C. D. Dix, J. C. Wolgamot and James Nolan.
The following officers were elected:
Charles Moran of Harmony, president; C. D. Dix, of Canby, vice-president; M. E. Kandle, of Highland, treasurer; J. C. Wolgamot, of Canby, chaplain; T. B. Hankins, of Oregon City, steward; J. W. Doty, of Eagle Creek, doorkeeper; W. S. Runyan, of Clackamas, lecturer and organizer.

W. W. Myers, W. T. Brayton and W. A. Mills were elected a business committee.
Prof. M. V. Rork announced from the chair that it would be in order to elect delegates to the state convention to be held when the county organizations were completed, whereupon one delegate was elected from each alliance as follows:

Springwater, Albert Loew; Harmony, Chas. Moran; Highland, M. E. Kandle; Eagle Creek, J. W. Doty; Mount Hood, S. D. Coleman; Clackamas, W. A. Mills; Canby, James Nolan; Molokai, R. Goucher; Maple Lane, T. B. Hankins.

Fifteen dollars was raised to defray expenses of the county alliance charter to be apportioned among the different sub-alliances.

Mr. T. H. McGill, editor of the North-west Reform Journal, made a short address, after which the newly elected officers were installed by Prof. Rork, who urged united action among the different sub-alliances, and spoke very encouragingly of the future prospects.

The representative of THE ENTERPRISE, who had been kindly invited to the secretary's table to take notes, had to retire at the close of Prof. Rork's speech, as the alliance was going into secret session and the reporter had lost the password.
