EDITOR ENTERPRISE: Your edition of May 29th is before me, which I have read with much interest. By the correspondence from all quarters I see that the Willamette valley is indeed having a steady, healthy growth.

This Harney valley is unique in its way. It is nearly a plain, surrounded by grazing hills. As one approaches it from the north, or Canyon City road, and ascends a hill about fourteen miles from the thriving village of Burns, a beautiful view is spread out before the eye.

In the far distance is what appears to be low hills surmounted by fleecy clouds looking not unlike the ocean, than nearer, a vast plain covered with a green carpet, and Sylvia's river, and its branches fringed with willows, and nearer, still great fields of what appears to be potatoes, spotted with green meadows and running streams, but upon a close inspection, the potatoes fields turn to sage brush.
