WEATHER AND CROPS.

The Observer for the Week ending Saturday, September 12.

Temperature has been lower, yet not so average. The atmosphere is clearer of smoke, the weather partly cloudy and local showers during the latter part of the week.

Wheat has done no material damage. They have delayed some late and somewhat retarded hop picking in a few sections. The threshing is practically over, only a few lots yet remaining to be threshed. The wheat is being delivered to elevators. The crop is never better, the berry is large, the yield was heavy, more than was anticipated. Hops are reported from everywhere in Washington county for every acre yielded 40 bushels per acre. Some reported that usual yield is not this year so extensive, but is more affected than usual. The oat crop has failed but not proportionally as the wheat crop. Hop picking about finished next week, unless present rains should delay the harvest more than is now expected. Hops of Douglas county were superior from line and mould, and some yards are found to be damaged. No lice are observed in Josephine county. It is estimated that lice and mould have done about 50 per cent of the hop crop to the extent of the crop. In Jackson and Josephine counties, the crop is of good quality and summer following is in progress of the Willamette valley.

Morrow, Umatilla and Baker counties; in the latter county, in Union, Wallowa and interior counties harvesting and threshing is well along. Reports indicate yields above the average and above the expectations of the farmers in every county. The wheat has begun to move to seaboard. Fruit continues plentiful. Grapes are plentiful in many localities.
