OCTOBER WEATHER.

Western Oregon Has an Exceptionally Wet Month.

The month of October has been exceptionally free from violent atmospheric disturbances. It has been characterized by a general uniformity of climatic conditions which have proved of decided value to agricultural and horticultural interests throughout the Pacific slope.

RAINFALL.

There has been a decided deficiency of precipitation throughout California, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, eastern Oregon, eastern Washington, and partly in western Washington. The only region of excess was confined to western Oregon. The deficiency ranges from 12 inches at Yuma to 1.65 at Eureka and 1.43 at Port Angeles.

TEMPERATURE.

It has been above the normal in all districts from Mexico to British Columbia but the excess is not generally very great. It was greatest in Arizona, western Oregon, eastern Washington, and southwestern California, within which regions the excess ranged from 5 to 8 degrees.

Grand Jury Report.

In the circuit court for Oregon for Clackamas county, report of the grand jury to Hon. F. J. Taylor, judge of said court.

The undersigned grand jury for the present term of this court respectfully reports as follows: We visited briefly the various county offices and found them so far as we were able to judge, properly conducted and the books and records in fair condition.

We find the jail in fair condition and properly kept. We recommend that the rear door of the jail corridor be repaired and strengthened and the lock shifted to the outside.

Recorded indebtedness, \$62,314.83; Interest, approximated, 6,178.15; Total, \$68,492.98.

To the above tabulation should be added orders in clerks office not yet delivered which cannot be fully started but which usually amounts to \$1000.

We find the amount collected for taxes the present year is \$71,001.57 of which \$6,091.52 was in county orders and the balance cash.
