ON SEVENTH STREET

STEPS TAKEN TO COLLECT DELINQUENT TAXES.

The Collector Levies on the Property and Fixes Date of Sale—The Delinquents After an Injunction.

In accordance with the instruction of the city council at its November meeting the city recorder issued a warrant to the city collector commanding him to "forthwith levy upon the following lots and parts of lots of delinquent assessment payers for the improvement of Seventh street."

These property owners, who are delinquent in the total sum of \$3807.90, have combined to fight the collection of the tax.

An ENTERPRISE reporter interviewed Councilman C. D. Latourette, of counsel for the delinquent taxpayers, in reference to the steps which the property owners would take to prevent the city from collecting the Seventh street tax.

"Our first step," said Mr. Latourette, "shall be to enjoin the city collector from selling the property according to his published notice. The petition for this injunction we expect to have completed this week."

"On what ground is the injunction sought?" asked the reporter.

"The principal ground will be that of irregularity on the part of the city in the proceedings to authorize the improvement and since there will be several other allegations but we think this one sufficient."

"If such influences be permitted to rule where would we have the expansive growth of modern cities?"

"Let them grow in other directions," answered the councilman-counselor. "If a man wishes a quiet home he ought to be allowed to have it and he ought to have power to prevent the improvement of streets that will bring the dust and noise of a busy thoroughfare to disturb the quietude of his home."

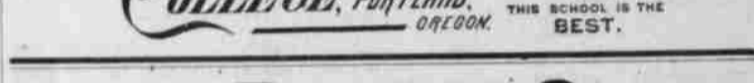
