COUNTY COMMITTEE.

THE COUNTY CONVENTION WILL BE HELD MARCH 23.

Most of the Primaries to be March 19—Apportionment of the Delegates by Precincts.

According to the notice sent out by the chairman and secretary of the republican county committee the committee met at the office of Secretary H. E. Cross Wednesday afternoon.

A republican convention for the county of Clackamas, state of Oregon, is called to meet in Oregon City on Wednesday, the 23d day of March, 1892, at 10 o'clock A. M.

The convention will consist of 112 delegates appointed among the several precincts, as follows: Abernethy, 3; Marquans, 4; Barlow, 3; Milwaukie, 6; Beaver Creek, 3; Milk Creek, 2; Borings, 2; Needy, 3; Canemah, 2; New Era, 3; Cascades, 4; Oregon City, No. 1, 3; Clackamas, 4; Oregon City, No. 2, 8; Canyon Creek, 2; Oswego, 6; Canby, 4; Pleasant Hill, 3; Cherryville, 2; Springwater, 2; Damascus, 4; Soda Springs, 3; Eagle Creek, 2; Sliever, 2; Ely, 2; Tualatin, 3; Clatskanie, 2; Upper Molalla, 3; George, 2; Union, 2; Hardings, 2; Viola, 2; Highland, 2; West Side, 2; Lower Molalla, 2.

The same being one delegate at large from each precinct and one delegate for every twenty-four votes and one for every fraction of one-half or over thereof cast for congressman at the June election in 1890.

Primaries for the purpose of choosing delegates to the county convention will be held in the several precincts on Saturday, March 19, at the hour of 1 o'clock P. M., except in Oregon City precinct No. 1, Oregon City precinct No. 2, Oswego and Ely.

The primaries in Oregon City Precinct No. 1 and Oregon City precinct No. 2, will be held on March 19, 1892, in conformity with the new election law governing primary elections in cities, and in the absence of any existing organization E. M. Rands and H. E. Cross of this committee are hereby authorized to call the primaries in said precincts, and instructed to make all necessary provisions for the execution of the law.

All voters who favor the republican policy of internal improvements, protection of American productions and labor, and guarding sacredly the rights of every American citizen at home and abroad are cordially invited to unite with us.
