The smelt season is at its height, and those delicious little fish are now as cheap as ever they get. They are swarming in the Cowlitz, which seems to be their headquarters, and already the gulls and loons have gone there to soar and scream and gorge themselves on the smelt that every bare spot of bank leaves exposed.

It is said that the desert lands in the Yakima valley, which belong to the GENERAL railroad company, but which are covered by the big ditch now being constructed are held at \$45 per acre.
