Home Rule for Scotland.

London, March 19-All liberal members from Scotland and many English O & C R R Co to Henry B Lamb members, including some conservatives, approve the bill introduced in parliament | Henry B Lamb and wife to Milton today for the creation of a Scottish legislative body. She will take white hunters and sail as soon as possible north. The Upton liner Zambesi arrived this morning, twenty-two days from Kobe. She has three cabin passengers, thirty-two Japanese and sixtytwo Chinese for Victoria, and seven Chinese and 100 tons of freight for Portland.
