WEATHER AND CROPS.

Report of the Condition in Western Oregon for the Week.

WEATHER.

The mean temperature has ranged from 60 to 70 degrees, which is from three to five degrees a day below the average. The weather has been partly cloudy and the average sunshine has not prevailed.

The rain was of great benefit, especially to late sown grain, to corn and garden truck; while in portions of the coast counties it did some damage to hay.

The oats crop is just beginning to be cut in a few localities, but it too is not an average. The wheat crop of 1891, in the counties west of the Cascades, amounted to eight and one-half million bushels, and the crop this year will be about from 15 to 20 per cent less than last year.
