

Captain J. L. Smith of the steamer Modoc which runs upon the upper river says that the breakwater which the electric company placed across the river the past season raised the water as far up as Ash Island where in extreme low water it increased the depth fully six inches, while at Polalla bar opposite New Era it added 15 inches to the depth, thus making boating much safer and better. The change at Rock Island is very marked both at low and high water reducing the danger of passage fully one-half at all stages. Other captains fully agree with Captain Smith in the statement that upper river navigation has been greatly improved. It is not surprising that it helped the river at low water, but that it should render Rock Island less dangerous at high water is a matter of considerable importance and quite a surprise to river men.
