

Interesting Historical Reminiscence.

The New York Sun recalls the fact that in April, 1863, Dr. James McBride, a brother of Judge T. A. McBride of this city, was appointed as United States minister to the Hawaiian Islands by President Lincoln. Soon after going there he had the American coat of arms placed over the entrance to the American legation.

In 1864 an English man-of-war stopped at Honolulu, having on board two cadets in the English navy, both sons of peers. One of them, Lord Charles Beresford, is now high in the service. This was during the war of the rebellion, when England was rather unfriendly to the United States, and many Englishmen were inclined to think that the United States government was of no special consequence, and was practically destroyed.

One night Lord Charles Beresford and his friend, in order to show their contempt for the United States government, went to the American legation, tore down Dr. McBride's coat-of-arms, and hired a native to row them with it out into the bay where their ship was anchored.

On learning next morning that the coat-of-arms was missing, the American minister instituted a search, and soon found the native who had taken it to the ship. A search warrant was procured and the coat-of-arms brought back by an officer. The commandant of the man-of-war and the English minister at Honolulu immediately called on the American minister and offered an apology in the name of their government for the insult which had been offered. After having made their apology, they stated that they supposed this was satisfactory, and that they had atoned for the offence. The American minister informed them that this was not satisfactory, and that these two young lords, who were officers of the British government, had not only committed a theft, but had by their act, insulted the government represented by him. He further said that, having taken down the coat-of-arms with their own hands, he would not be satisfied until they themselves put it back where they got it. At this the English minister and commandant vehemently protested, saying that such a demand was humiliating and disgraceful and could not be complied with. The American minister, however insisted on a compliance with his demand, saying that the disgrace consisted in the act of stealing the coat-of-arms, and that nothing short of this would be considered reparation for their offence. After considerable diplomatic correspondence and some delay, the English minister agreed to comply with the demand of Dr. McBride, and the latter mentioned the next noon as the time when the coat-of-arms should be replaced.

It was soon noise about Honolulu that the two young men were to replace the coat-of-arms the next day at 12 o'clock. When the time came thousands of people from the city and surrounding country were there to witness the ceremony. A photograph of the scene was taken, and it is said that a relative of Minister McBride in Salem now has a copy of this photograph. The young fellow also apologized to Dr. McBride for the insult.

Minister McBride reported the affair to Secretary Seward, who complimented him and demanded an apology from the English government, which was made, and the two young men called home and dismissed from the navy for five years. Lord Charles Beresford has since won distinction in the English army. He commanded the landing force at Alexandria in 1882.

ORDINANCE NO. —
AN ORDINANCE to provide for the time and manner of constructing certain sewers in portions of the city of Oregon City, Oregon, Third, Center, Washington, East Adams, Jefferson, Madison, Monroe, 1st, 4th, 5th, Adams, Jackson streets in Oregon City, Oregon, as hereinabove described, and establishing sewer district No. 3 in said city, and providing for the assessment of the cost upon the property benefited thereby.

SECTION I.—That all that portion of Oregon City, and described as follows:

Beginning at the south east corner of block thirty (30) in Oregon City; thence easterly on the north line of Second street to the southerly line of the Oregon City claims; thence easterly on the north line of Second street to the center of the tract of land in the public square owned by the Oregon City school district; thence northerly on the east line of the said school district's land to the south line of Seventh street; thence westerly on the south line of Seventh street; thence westerly on the south line of Eighth street to the west line of Jefferson street; thence northwesterly on the west line of Jefferson street to the center of the block to the center of block No. 52; thence northerly on the south line of Ninth street; thence westerly on Ninth street to the top of the bluff; thence southerly along the top of the bluff; thence easterly along the top of the bluff; thence thence westerly along the top of the bluff; thence easterly along the top of the bluff; thence thence westerly along the top of the bluff; thence easterly through the center of the block to the center of the block to the south line of Center street; thence southerly along the west line of Center street to the south line of Seventh street; thence westerly along the south line of Seventh street to the edge of the bluff; thence southerly along the south line of Second street; thence east along the north line of Second street projected to the place of beginning, including blocks and fractional blocks as follows: Blocks 30, 31, 32, 33, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 41; lots 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 in block 32; blocks 53, 54, 56, 57, 58, 59, 61, 62, 63, 64; lots 3, 4, 5 and 6 in block 65; lots 101, 102, 103, 104, 105 and 106; fractional blocks 20, 21, 22, 23, 24 and 25; fractional block 21; blocks 29, 19, 18, 25, 26 and 27; fractional block 22; fractional block 23; blocks 30, 31, 32, 33, 34 and 35; and a strip 200 feet wide off of the westerly end of the public square, all in the same addition, but the same as the construction of the sewer district, to be known as sewer district No. 2.

SEC. 2.—The location and kind and quality of said sewers to be constructed in said district, are as follows, to wit:

1. A 36 inch brick and stone sewer beginning at the Willamette river, at the foot of Eighth street in Oregon City; thence easterly along Eighth street to the foot of the bluff; thence easterly up the side of the bluff to Seventh street; thence northerly through Seventh street to Washington street.

2. An 18 inch vitrified sewer pipe, beginning at a point 120 feet north of the north line of Main street in Oregon City, Oregon, from a point where the line of Center street to Main sewer in Sixth street.

3. An 18 inch pipe beginning at the center of Fourth and Center streets; thence northerly on Center street to sewer on Seventh street.

4. A 6 inch pipe in Sixth street, beginning 105 feet west of the west line of Center street; thence northerly to sewer on Center street.

5. A six inch pipe beginning at the east line of High street in Fifth street; thence easterly on High street to sewer in Center street.

6. A 6 inch pipe beginning at the center of High street in Fourth street; thence easterly on High street to sewer on Center street.

7. An 18 inch pipe beginning at the north line of Third street in Jefferson street; thence northerly on Jefferson street to connect with 12 inch pipe in Third street to sewer in Center street.

8. An 18 inch pipe beginning at the center of Adams street in Third street; thence westerly on Adams street to connect with the sewer in Washington street.

9. An 18 inch pipe beginning at the center of Adams and Washington streets; thence westerly on Adams street to connect with the sewer in Washington street.
