Mr. Heckman then talked on the subject. "Should textbooks be furnished free to the schools. He thought they ought to be. He said that in Pennsylvania the state from which he came that such was the custom and he thought it an excellent plan.

Miss Porter then presented the subject of drawing. She thought that drawing should be a leading feature in every branch of study.

The subject of music in the public schools was opened for discussion by Miss Rowen. She said that in order to make a success of music, it would be necessary to make it one of the studies in which the applicant for a teacher's certificate must be proficient.
