COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS.

Order Relative to Delinquent Taxes—Road Matters—The Bills.

In the matter of the Oregon City and Oswego road the report of the viewers was filed and their expense account of \$34.30; also the claims of H. H. Johnson and D. Magone for damages. The matter was referred back to the viewers and surveyor with instructions to comply with the requirements of the code in making the survey, to meet for that purpose at the place of beginning on Monday the 25th day of September at 10 o'clock A. M.

In the matter of the Oswego and Sucker Creek road J. U. Campbell appeared for the petitioners and G. E. Hayes for the remonstrators and after the lists had been carefully examined there remained 48 names on the petition and 47 on the remonstrance so the road was allowed as petitioned for, Commissioner Scott voting no, and ordered opened with the labor of petitioners. The expense account of \$11.80 was allowed.

Report of viewers on Oswego and Springbrook road filed and approved. Claim of Wm. Tarrant for damages filed and C. F. Clarke, C. C. Babcock and H. H. Johnson appointed to assess damages to meet at the beginning point of said survey on Wednesday, September 20th, at 10 o'clock A. M. Expense account of \$57.70 allowed.

Report of viewers upon resurvey and relocation of the Oregon City and Sandy road read and approved. Expense account of \$18.90 allowed.

Petition of C. Heiser et. al. for a change in a county road granted and Sidney Smyth appointed surveyor with R. Merton, Jas. Wilson and William Ulrich as viewers to meet on Thursday September 19th at the place of beginning at 10 o'clock A. M.

The clerk was authorized to cancel unclaimed county warrants drawn over 7 years prior to July 1, 1893, amounting to \$49. The clerk was also authorized to cancel warrants No. 1121 for \$1 and 133 for \$3.30 which had been taken from his office but not presented.

Proposition of C. F. Clarke to improve the Clackamas and Milwaukee road accepted the work to be done at once under the supervision of A. W. Cooke.

Application of J. C. Morley for refund of tax paid by him for land erroneously sold for taxes granted and clerk authorized to draw warrant in his favor for \$9.72.

Application of M. F. Ambler and others for a county road granted and Sidney Smyth appointed surveyor with A. Mather, J. D. Rush and William Johnson as viewers to meet at the place of beginning on Monday, the 18th day of September at 10 o'clock A. M.

Report of A. W. Cooke supervisor of road district No. 1 approved and expense account allowed as follows: Labor \$126; material, \$203.91; supervision, \$64. The supervisor was also ordered to procure the necessary material and repair the bridge over Johnson Creek near Kindorf Bros' slaughter house. The recommendation of the supervisor that an appropriation be made for the improvement of the Baker bridge and Grimm's bluff road was approved and \$300 appropriated for said improvement.

Report of E. P. Carter supervisor of road district No. 4 approved and expense account allowed as follows: For work on Molalla bridge near Canby, \$11.50; for work on Rock Creek bridge, \$66.34.

Clerk authorized to issue a warrant for \$600 in favor of Payne and Counsel in part payment for the improvement now being made by them at Grimm's bluff.

Report of W. H. Smith supervisor of

road district No. 2 approved and claims allowed as follows: Labor, \$49.50; Material \$12.77.

Report of P. S. Fliteroff upon the improvement of the Oregon City and Apperson road approved and expense account of \$399.94 ordered paid out of the county road fund.

Report of A. W. Cooke upon the improvement of the Clackamas and Baker Ferry road approved and expense account of \$256.88 allowed and a further appropriation of \$120.88 made to complete the work.

Relative to payment for work upon the Baker bridge and Fagalds Mill road the clerk was authorized to draw warrant upon the fund appropriated to the amount of \$132.86 as approved by A. W. Cooke.

Report of the county board of equalization approved and the assessor ordered to make from the statement the assessment roll and the clerk to make two copies of the same.

Application of Helen Thompkins for rebate of tax granted and the sheriff authorized to credit her with \$31.42 on land tax and apply the same in payment of mortgage tax for 1892.

The sum of \$75 was appropriated toward the improvement of the Forsyth road to be expended under the direction of supervisor Smith who is authorized to collect and expend the contributions promised.

Petition of H. Z. Burkhart and others for a county road granted and Sidney Smyth appointed surveyor with Thos. Miller, G. W. Prosser and Max Schulpus as viewers to meet at the place of beginning on Thursday, September 28th at 10 o'clock A. M.

Proposition of Glass & Prudhome to supply county records laid over till the October term.

Sheriff authorized to accept from the S. P. R. R. the sum tendered for taxes as per the list of lands filed by said company with the county clerk on the 5th day of August, 1893.

Application of C. T. Tooze et al. for reduction of ferry rates at Boone's Ferry laid over till the October term and clerk instructed to notify party running the same of said application.

The sum of \$100 was appropriated to be used in protecting the bridge across the Molalla on the Dickey Prairie road to be expended under the supervision of E. P. Carter who is authorized to collect and expend any contributions that may be made.

Mileage and per diem of the commissioners allowed as follows: C. Bair, three days and 28 miles, \$11.80 R. Scott, three days and 18 miles, \$10.80
