Regular May Term Held Wednesday Evening.

A Lively Tilt Between the Council and City Attorney—Bills Allowed—Other Business.

The regular May meeting of the council was called to order by Mayor Straight and all councilmen and officers found to be present.

The application of M. H. Flanagan for a continuance of his liquor license granted.

Application of G. H. Canfield for refund of \$23, the amount paid for a cemetery lot, granted for the reason that said lot had been sold to Mrs. Eastham.

The recorder reported for April one case for disorderly conduct in his court for which a fee of \$5 was imposed and not collected.

City engineer D. W. Kinnaird reported the amount due Hamshaw & Behm as \$2221.11, and a warrant for the amount was ordered drawn on the Main street fund for the amount.

As to the bills of E. F. Driggs, as city attorney, the committee reported the same without recommendation.

Relative to the cases in the mayor's court against Armstrong and Preston for gambling and the bill of the city attorney for prosecuting the same it was ordered to defer action till the cases had been reported by the mayor.

The report of R. L. Holman, city treasurer was reported unsatisfactory by the financial committee on account of its incompleteness, and it was referred back to the committee for them to secure a satisfactory report.
