ONE OF THE GOV'S PETS.—The career of Fred Van Wagner in this city has been noted in times gone by, but on Monday he was placed under arrest by Chief of Police Minto of Salem for burglary and the following interesting personal history of this one of the governor's pets has come out.

THAT MT. HOOD KILLING.—Tuesday's Oregonian says a false report that by two masked highmen near Government camp early Monday morning and the driver, Richard Banfield, and one of the horses killed, was circulated widely on the streets yesterday, and found currency in the evening paper. Inquiry into the facts of the case showed that the story will not hold water, and that some one must have been lying tremendously.

ANOTHER PEST.—A yellow flower weed has taken possession of the country along the Dallas road, near Eola, spreading rapidly and crowding out all other vegetation. Nothing appears to eat it, and the pastures covered with it are worthless.

WILLSON WAS HELD.—Pastor Willson has had to answer to three charges before a Portland justice upon all of which he was held to the grand jury. The first charge of forgery preferred against him was heard Friday morning at the request of the prisoner, William and Lena Wagner were the complaining witnesses.

HILL'S ROAD COMING.—Reports from Portland are to the effect that the proposed traffic arrangement between the Great Northern and the O. R. & N. is in a fair way to be consummated at an early date, and it is probable that a similar agreement will be consummated with the Union Pacific at the same time.

CLACKAMAS JOINT SENATOR.—The Eugene Journal says: "Hon. Alonzo Gesner, joint state senator from Marion and Clackamas counties, made us a call on Friday afternoon of last week, on his way from where he had spent three weeks surveying in the mountains south of the McKenzie and opposite Blue River, to Lake Creek in the Coast mountains in the Siuslaw country where he has another surveying contract.

WILL REMODEL THE CHURCH.—Something like six years ago the Presbyterian church was organized in this city with eight members and about a year later Rev. G. Wm. Giboney was called and installed as pastor. Since that time the growth of the church and kindred societies has been constant and the work done by the society in the community eminently important and salutary.

AN INSECT DESTROYER.—Superintendent Lelong, of the California state board of horticulture, who promised to send a colony of Australian "black lady-birds" to the Oregon board of horticulture in June, writes to Secretary Sargent that they were collected, but owing to the stoppage of mail trains they had to be liberated again.

LOGGERS ON A TOOT.—A dispatch from Independence to the Sunday Oregonian says that last night twenty loggers made an attempt to take this town for several hours and made night hideous with their carousing. Three million feet of logs for Oregon City are floating past town and these men follow the logs.

W. S. LADD'S ESTATE.—Suit has been commenced in the United States circuit court by D. Albert Hiller and Sarah F. Hiller, his wife, of San Francisco, against Caroline A. Ladd, William M. Ladd, Charles and Wesley Ladd, executors of the last will and testament of W. S. Ladd, deceased, by the filing of a bill in equity, calling for an accounting, through which complainants expect to recover from the Ladd estate a million dollars or more.

CHICAGO, July 22.—The A. R. U. has issued the following: "We propose that the Pullman company shall be brought to justice, and in a way that shall necessitate a strike without its attendant ills. We have faith in the American people; they uphold justice; they love fair play we appeal to the great American public, to every man and every good woman, not to ride in a Pullman car until the Pullman company does justice to its employees. Let the cars run absolutely empty. Friends of labor, no lover of humanity will occupy a seat or berth in a Pullman car. Let this policy be inaugurated, and then we will see how long the railway companies will be bound by the contracts, as they have induced the people to believe, to haul Pullman cars. We propose to continue the fight against the Pullman company through good and evil report, and without regard to consequences, until justice shall be done. There will be no surrender. We will use every available and lawful means to press the contest.
