Report for First Month Ending October 12, 1894.

School opened September 17, with an enrollment of 117 which has increased to 187. The report of the departments are as follows:

First and second grades, Miss Miller, teacher.—Whole number enrolled, 54; average number belonging, 46; average daily attendance, 44; number of times tardy, 7; number of pupils not absent nor tardy, 26.

Third and fourth grades, Miss Bickner, teacher.—Whole number enrolled, 43; average number belonging, 39; average daily attendance, 38; number of times tardy, 3; number of pupils not tardy nor absent, 31.
