HOUSE BILL NO. 251.

To prohibit minors from visiting evil resorts:

It shall be unlawful for any minor to go into or visit under any pretext or for any purpose whatever, any house of prostitution, or any room or place inhabited or frequented by any prostitute, or used for purposes of prostitution.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to procure, request, at night, or with hounds; fine \$25 to order, or to in any wise induce any minor to go into or visit any such house, room or place, described in section 1 hereof, for any purpose whatever.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction thereof, he punished by a fine not less than \$100 and not more that \$250, or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not exceeding one year, or both ; and any corporation violating any of the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000.

Any minor violating any of the provisions of this act, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$100, or by incarceration for a period not exceeding six months in the state reform school.




