SUNDAY SCHOOL WORKERS.

The Tenth Annual State Convention convenes in Portland Next Week. The program has been issued for the tenth annual convention of the Oregon State Sunday School Association, to be held in the First Congregational church, Portland, May 7th, 8th and 9th. The topics for treatment are all in line with the convention theme, better things. While the entire program is designed to be of interest to every attendant, each one is certain to find something of special value in his particular line of Sunday school effort. The primary department is given the prominence that it demands, as being of perhaps the first importance. Three papers on various points in primary teaching are provided for, as well as a conference of all primary workers. Republican League Convention. The volume will be a large one, some 250 pages, and will contain several thousand names of active republicans, many of them living in this county, including all delegates to the state league, state convention, central committee, etc. It will be the roll of honor of the republican party in Oregon.
