AT THE EASTMAN SCHOOL.

The following is a report of the Eastman school for the month ending April 26, 1895:

Of the second grade B class, the following named pupils were given above 95 in deportment and class average: Edward Smalley, Emma Hinz, Rose Stromyer, Johnie Shaw and Stacy Nichols and Austin Nichols, and Arthur Stabins. Edward Smalley and Emma Hinz each made an average of 98 the highest in the grade.

Of the third grade B class, Lillie Thorp, has 99 in deportment and Jack Canfield 93 in daily work, Lillie Thorp having the highest general average in this class.

Those of the fourth grade B class, earning above 95 in deportment are Willie Koerner 90, Arthur Shaw 98, Angie Williams 98, Ida Dunes 99, Karl Haas 100, Minnie Phillips 100, Ola Riston 100. Those above 95 in daily attendance are Willie Koerner 96, Arthur Shaw 96, Thos. Strohmer 96, Karl Haas 97. Highest average in the grade was made by Karl Haas.

Of the fourth grade B class, Millard Hamilton, Norma White, and Clara Bartlett has 97 in deportment, while Theresa Staben and Edna Caulfield reached an average of 97 in daily work. Highest average of this class was made by Theresa Staben.
