The mining resources of Clackamas
county are being gradually developed,
and some Oregon City parties who re-
turned from the southeastern part of the
county, say that there is considerable
stir over the Copper creek placer mines,
situated east of the headwaters of Mo-
lalla. These mines were first discovered
about three months ago, and about fifty
claims have been located. The gold
found is of good quality, and a number
of men are busy developing their claims,
and there is a prospect of this camp be-
coming an important mining center.

Several Oregon City young men met
Tuesday evening and effected a prelimi-
nary organization of an anti-bloomer society.
This agitation of bloomer craze leads the
Portland Telegram to make the follow-
ing pointed remarks: "If the bloom-
ered woman is a fleeting fad, what is the
her culprit assailants allege, what is the

her retirement would be to utterly ignore
her."

The O. R. & N. Co's new steamer,
the Gypsy, has been completed and will
start up the river today. The little
steamer is 100 feet long by 23 feet beam,
and will not likely draw more than
ten inches of water. In very ordinary
water she will carry 40 tons of freight
and 50 passengers. She was built for
the purpose of keeping the river open to
Corvallis during all the season, and
when there is plenty of water she will be
used as a tender for other boats on the
river, and will operate between Corvallis
and Eugene.

The Clatskanie Chief gives an account
of a very successful teachers' institute
held at that place last week, and pays
the following compliment to Prof. H. S.
Strange, who delivered the address on
Monday evening: The professor hand-
led his subject in a very able and skill-
ful manner, showing himself to be a
thorough student of the public school
system, fully cognizant of its needs, and
realizing the importance of pure, whole-
some and earnest effort on the part of
both teacher and public. It was a very
logical and entertaining lecture.

from the family residence, at three p. m.,
Wednesday, and the remains were in-
terred in the Oregon City cemetery.
Mrs. Ely had been ill for the past three
months with that dread disease, con-
sumption.
