

BISMARCK, N. D., Sept. 23.—The tragic death of General Custer and his gallant men at the hands of the Sioux Indians in the massacre of the Little Big Horn was recalled here this week by the for-George A. Custer in 1876. The check is dated June 25, and is signed by B. L. Smith, at that time assistant paymaster in the army. It was on June 25, 1876. that the massacre took place. NEW YORK, Sept. 23 .- The World says: Lieutenant John M. Schoffeld will retire as commander-in-chief of the army September 29, and Nelson A. Miles will at once remove to Washington. as senior-major-general in command. There have been rumors that his not being a West Point graduate would be a handicap in obtaining this, the highest rang, but his unquestioned ability and popularity have effectally settled that point in his favor. General Ruger, who is now in Washington, revising the army regulations, will undoubtedly move to Governor's islands and assume command of the department of the East. This will obliterate any further change in department commander.
