

A small dish should be carefully weighed, a small amount of milk added and then weighed again. By subtracting the weight of the dish from the weight of both, the weight of the milk is found and carefully recorded.

The solids of milk have been found by innumerable analyses to average about 15 per cent, and while the fat varies in the milk from different cows, the solid left after extracting the fat is a very constant quantity, hardly ever falling below 9 per cent.

How to Cut Out a Boat Sail. It is unnecessary to go to a sailmaker to get a sail for a small boat for use on an inland lake or river.
