In the matter of the petition of C. E. Bowman et al, for the voting place of Milk creek to be changed from Union Mills to Grange hall, the prayer of the petition was granted.

In the matter of the bridge across Abernethy leading to Oregon City, it was ordered that the amount due the county as per order Dec term of court, 40 per cent of cost be paid. The cost of the bridge was \$500 and 40 per cent of the amount was \$200.

In the matter of the tax levy for 1895, it was ordered that the levy be as follows: State, 4.8 mills; county, 12 mills; school, 6 mills; road, 3.2 mills; total, 26 mills.

In the matter of the petition for the vacation of certain streets in Minthorn, the same was continued.

In the matter of the application of the Oregon City board of trade for the co-operation of the county in building a wagon road southward from the south end of Oregon City, the court ordered the county surveyor to make such preliminary survey and estimate of the cost of said road as may be necessary.

In the matter of the application of E. Covey for an increased allowance for the care and keeping of William W. Hill, the same was referred to Commissioner Jaggar with power to act. It was ordered that after March 1st, the appropriation for the support of J. Bonahansen be discontinued, and that a hook for his arm be furnished by the county.

In the matter of the support of C. Bergman it was ordered that he be removed to Mrs. Haas's on or before February 1st, 1895, otherwise the appropriation for his support will be discontinued.

The tax rebate heretofore granted F. G. Dement, was ordered revoked.

In the matter of the selection of official newspapers for the county, it appearing to the court that the Express and the Courier have the largest list of bona fide subscribers of the papers published in the county, it was ordered that said papers be selected as the official papers of the county, and that compensation for publishing said proceedings be fixed at 15 cents per square of ten lines of brevier type, (newspaper measure), or its equivalent.

In the matter of the appropriation made for the care of Samuel Porter, said Porter having died on or about December 15th, it was ordered that the warrants issue in favor of Wales Russell.

In the matter of the application of Ella Broslerick to correct irregularities in the title of certain lots in county addition to Oregon City, an order was made to conform with the application.

It was ordered that D. W. Kinnaird be appointed roadmaster at a salary of \$100 per month, he to serve at the option of the court.

A portion of West Oregon City precinct, in that section where M. K. Shipley and Frank Ford reside, was added to Oswego precinct.

The boundary line between Canemah and Maple Lane precincts was changed to include the S. S. White donation claim in the former precinct.

In the matter of the mileage and per diem of the commissioners, R. Scott was allowed \$16 66, and F. Jaggar \$16 20.
