SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE SESSION.

The matter of calling a special session of the legislature to remedy the somewhat profligate appropriations of the last regular meeting of that body, is being seriously considered by Governor Lord, and the subject is provoking much discussion pro and con.

The wisdom of calling such a special session is seriously doubted. Past experience proves that it costs money to hold sessions of the legislature, and a special session now would be no exception to the rule.

There can be no question but that there was much unwise and extravagant legislation, that has become part and parcel of our statutes, which was difficult to avoid in the conflicting entanglements, consequent upon a bitter contest for the election of a United States senator.

It is to be expected that the success of the poultry show held at Portland last week, will have the result of stimulating the business of poultry raising in Clackamas county. This is a profitable business that has heretofore been neglected to a considerable extent in this county.

A few days since the New York World sent telegrams to all the state banks, savings institutions, trust companies, and similar institutions in the country to test the feeling of the country towards the new government loan and of the willingness of small capitalists to subscribe for it.

of the private banks of Portland, Salem, and other Oregon points, offered to subscribe in the aggregate for about \$200,000 of the loan. The World claims that the definite and indefinite offers, made almost entirely from country banks, represent a total of at least two-thirds if not all of the one hundred millions of the loan.

It is now very evident that the Cubans have the upper hand of the situation, and it is not improbable that she may declare her independence at no distant day. The Cubans have possession of all the interior strong holds, while Spain holds only one point of any material strength.

OREGON CITY is to have another representative state gathering in May, the State Christian Endeavor convention. The executive committee of the local union are already actively at work making preparations for the great event, and the proper committees have been appointed.

THE details have been arranged and the preparations completed for the holding of the national republican convention in St. Louis. The sub-committee appointed to do the work have signed a contract with the business men's league for the care of the national convention to be held June 18th.

SPIRIT OF THE PRESS.

Since the ENTERPRISE called attention to the move that was under way to add a road commission to our already large list of useless state commissions, the press of the state has generally condemned the commission as an expensive luxury.

The next legislature of this state is advised by the people that it will be unnecessary to tamper with the road laws. It is intimated that the subject is to be brought before the law-making body and that there will be a half dozen gentlemen on hand to suggest that a commission be formed to look out for the public highways.

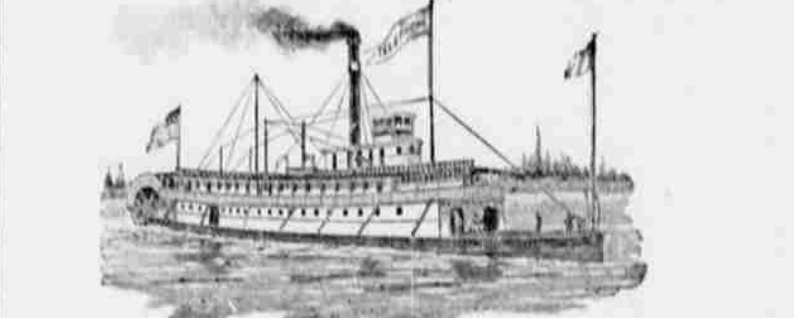
