A collection was then taken up which when placed with the one taken earlier in the day amounted to \$6.75 which would nearly pay all the present indebtedness of the County Sunday School association. The new president said he would like to see the convention adjourn free from debt.

A song, "A Sinner and a Song" by Miss Mabel Miller with an invisible chorus was well rendered and impressively received.
A short talk by Mr. T. R. A. Sellwood in which he exhorted one and all and especially the teachers to concentrated bible study, to not keep laying on the table as something nice to look at; but to prayerfully study it with a view to closer fellowship with Christ. Mr. Sellwood then spoke of the death of Mr. Seth Lewelling, who had been identified with the growth and development of Clackamas county, since '51 or '52, announcing that his funeral service would be held at Town hall at 1 o'clock p. m. inviting the delegates to attend and requesting all strangers to be present.

At 8:30 Rev. M. L. Rugg, pastor of the Baptist church in Oregon City gave an address on the "Sunday School as an Educator" which was very impressive. Only for lack of space we would give it in full. He said education means more than knowledge, more than mere moral-

ly, we can easily see the value of the Sunday school as an educator, when we realize that there is so much lacking in the outside world, he gave statistics to show that an overwhelming majority of the criminals of today were young men under 25 years of age, thus showing that it had been a detriment to civilization to banish the teaching of Christianity in the free schools. Hence the great need of the Sunday school as an educator.

After Mr. Rugg's address others talked and the convention then adjourned, all delegates being requested to see Mrs. Wilson, chairman of the entertainment committee, to be assigned to places of entertainment. However the Oregon City delegation took cars for home, which lessened the number of visitors considerably.

Sunday, a day of revival services. At 10 o'clock a. m. song service was led by Geo. Howard of Oregon City. All who know Mr. Howard will readily and correctly guess that a real revival was the result of this half hour of song.

At 10:30 there was preaching service by Rev. W. G. Holt of Woodstock, was to have officiated but not being present Rev. C. B. Shields, Presbyterian missionary preached the morning service, taking for his text Isaiah 30, latter part of 15th verse, "the Lord will surely deliver us; this city shall not be delivered into the hands of Assyria." He preached an able sermon, emphasizing the power of God to deliver this world out of the hand of Satan.

At 3 o'clock p. m. the convention again assembled and was led in a song and testimony service by J. K. Groom, in the absence of Ed Maple of Oregon City, who was to have led, according to program. This service closed by singing the hymn "Blessed Assurance."

At 3:30 there was preaching service by Rev. M. M. Lewis of the Second Baptist church of East Portland. His text was Eph. 6:4, "and ye fathers provoke not your children to wrath, but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord." He said "as the twig is the bow," consequently parents could not begin training their children in the religion of Jesus Christ too early in life. All of our great men, said Mr. Lewis have been taught to love the Lord at home, at their mother's knee, and not thrown wholly upon the Sabbath school or upon the pastor. While he spoke very heartily in favor of the Sabbath school as a spiritual educator for children, he said the great bulk of the work devolved upon the parents Sunday evening.

At 7 o'clock meeting was again assembled and was led in a song service by A. F. Parker, of Oregon City. After singing several selections, Mrs. J. G. Wilson led in prayer.

At 7:30 gospel services were opened by singing "Showers of Blessing" and Rev. Mauer led in prayer.

Rev. J. Weir of Oregon City was to have preached, but not being present, Rev. Mauer read the lesson and Mr. Sellwood preached.
