Republican Rally at Oswego.

The following account of the Republican club rally at Oswego, is taken from the Ironworker:
"The ground was covered with snow, the weather unpleasant, but notwithstanding these drawbacks, and that there were other meetings in the town on the same night, over one hundred of our citizens, including a few ladies, assembled in Kellogg opera house last Saturday evening in response to an invitation by the Citizens' Republican Club of Oswego. While the inclemency of the weather deterred a large number from being present, the attendance was very gratifying and evinced a strong desire to promote the welfare of the republican party and encourage the promulgation of the Citizen's Republican club.

Although the only orator of the evening, Prof. H. S. Strange made up for the deficiency in that respect with a sound republican speech and the deliverance of thoughts formed from extensive knowledge, after profound study and research, and matured upon honest convictions. The professor prefaced his remarks by expressing pleasure in seeing so many who, in the face of other allurement, had congregated to advance the interests and uphold the principles of the republican party. The speaker devoted most of his time to the two leading issues, finance and tariff, and advocated bimetalism and protection. Throughout the address he had the close attention of the assemblage and at intervals and at the close was applauded and thanked for his able discourse. The professor spoke for an hour and a half and at the conclusion the meeting adjourned.
