Democratic County Convention.

On Saturday of this week the democratic convention for Clackamas county will convene in Oregon City in Pope's hall. But little interest was apparently manifested in the primaries, and the full party vote was not polled. The heaviest vote at primaries is usually polled during the closing hours, but last Saturday evening was so cold, windy and rainy that many of the voters preferred hurrying home after completing their work, than exercising the inalienable right of every American citizen to cast his vote at the primaries. In some of the outside precincts no primaries were held. But few of the outside precincts have been heard from, however, it is learned that Lower Molalla and Maple Lane will not send in delegations. It is very probable that a full party ticket will be nominated at Saturday's convention, and an active campaign begun.

Among those prominently mentioned for places on the ticket are: W. B. Stafford, for clerk; John Lewellen, of Springfield, for sheriff; E. C. Hackett, of Parkplace, for assessor; A. H. Schram, of Oregon City, for recorder. Of course, there is plenty of available material of good quality for official positions, from other sections of the county, whose names will be considered at the convention.
