Chautauqua Notes.

Professor W. H. Boyer, the popular leader of the Apollo club of Portland has been engaged by the Chautauqua management for the music at the summer assembly. Many will recall the ovation given to Professor Boyer a few weeks ago at the Marquam Grand where he brought out Hayden's great oratorio, "The Creation" with several hundred singers. At the close of the magnificent performance Professor Boyer was called before the footlights and crowned with laurel amid the deafening applause of the immense audience. Professor Boyer has spoken to his Apollo club to enlist them in giving "The Creation" here at the Chautauqua on the opening night of the assembly and they have one and all voted to help him make this one of the greatest musical events in the history of the Northwest. The Salem singers are also practicing on "The Creation" and will come and join the Portland singers in this great musical festival. Professor Boyer wishes to meet all the Oregon City singers next Wednesday evening, June 3, at the Methodist church where he will begin drilling them on special music for the assembly. The Chautauqua managers pay Professor Boyer \$100 for this work, thus giving the Oregon City singers the advantage of training under an acknowledged master and it is hoped that every singer in the city will attend Professor Boyer's rehearsals and assist him in every way to make this musical event long to be remembered in the history of Oregon. Grand Marshall's Orders. General orders for Decoration Day, May 30, 1896. Headquarters committee on Decoration Day, Grant Army hall, May 27, '96.

The undersigned having been requested to act as Grand Marshal on Decoration Day, promulgates the following orders: 1. Headquarters will be established on Main street in front of Willamette hall.

2. All Aids will report at headquarters ters at 8:30 a. m. prompt, and receive orders for assignments. 3. The Parkplace band will report at headquarters promptly at 8:30 and proceed in charge of officers to escort children and different orders to their places in column. The several organizations and societies taking part in the parade will assemble at their several places of meeting and will be escorted from there to their assigned places in column.

5. Column will, at 10 a. m., promptly move south on Maine street to cement works, thence counter march Main street to 10th street, thence out said street along road up the bluff to 7th street, and thence out said street to cemetery. 6. At the conclusion of ceremonies at the cemetery, at the sound of the bugle, the column will form at the west gate of the cemetery grounds in the order designated for the march out, and return to city, and at the arrival at the several headquarters will be dismissed.

It is hoped that all societies and organizations will maintain the position in the column until dismissed at their several headquarters. C. H. DAUCHEY, Marshal.
