CIRCUIT COURT PROCEEDINGS.

The Adjourned Term Completes Its Labors—Several Mismatched Couples Made Happy.

In the matter of the estate of Matilda D. Holt, deceased, Thomas Holt, contestant vs C. M. Idleman, executor and proponent. Heard on appeal from the county court for Clackamas county. Appellant and proponent appearing by Hedges & Griffith, respondent and contestant by J. K. Weatherford and A. S. Dresser. Taken under advisement.

Oak Grove Land and Improvement Company vs Charles Charles S. Bunnell; decree for plaintiff. Miller & Miller for plaintiffs. Decree of possession of property for plaintiff.

Oak Grove Land and Improvement Company vs Isaac Anderson; W Y Masters for plaintiff. Plaintiff given a decree of possession of said premises.

Margaret West vs T. L. West; Miller & Miller for plaintiff. The plaintiff and defendant were married at Portland in September, and according to the allegations of the former the defendant abandoned his wife at Silverton, Marion county, in 1893, and has since that time remained away from her. The plaintiff was granted a decree of divorce on the plea of desertion, and awarded the custody of the minor children.

George Lazelle and Thomas Duncan, executors of the will of J. K. Bingham, deceased, vs J W May, et al; judgment for \$171.75, attorney fees, etc. Execution issued, and attached property ordered sold. Hedges & Griffith for plaintiff.

Lizzie P. Scollard vs David H. Close; E. C. Maddock, referee, reported that he had sold lots 6, 7 and 8 of block 4, of Edgewood, to T. F. Ryan for the consideration of \$402.25, said property belonging to said litigants equally. The sheriff's sale of said property was confirmed.

Mary A. Lehigh vs J Leonard Charman; motion to strike out certain portion of defendant's answer, was overruled.

Fred Schriever vs Balthazer Kurz; C. D. Latourette and G. W. Swope for plaintiff. Ordered if garnishes fail to appear he shall be liable to the penalties, etc.

Theresa Kramer vs Rudolph Winterer, et al; dismissed for want of equity, and that defendant, A. P. Loeing, recover of and from the plaintiff his costs and disbursements taxed at \$35.35, and that execution issue therefor.

Elizabeth Woerner vs Peter Woerner; this cause coming up on motion of plaintiff by her attorneys, C. D. and D. C. Latourette, and it appearing by stipulation of parties on file that this action has been settled, it is therefore ordered that said case be dismissed.

Mahala Wallace vs Alexander Wallace; action for divorce. The plaintiff appeared in person and by Brownell & Campbell, her attorneys, defendant not appearing and default entered. The plaintiff and defendant were married in Oregon City on November 28th, 1884, and the former alleges desertion for a period of more than one year. She was awarded the custody of the four minor children.

William N. Marshall vs Melissa Marshall; Brownell & Campbell for plaintiff. Plaintiff and defendant were married in Clackamas county on March 11th, 1895, and the former alleges desertion and personal indignities on the part of the defendant. A decree of divorce was granted.

F C Buck vs John Evans, et al; sheriff's sale confirmed.

Laura B Burnham vs Henry P Burnham; Reid & Bell for plaintiff; They were married in Oregon City on October 23rd, 1879, and the plaintiff alleges desertion on the part of the defendant. The decree was granted.

Samuel Matthews vs S V Lewelling and W S U'Ren; plaintiff appeared in

person and by W. H. Dohyans, and plaintiff by W. S. U'Ren. Motion filed by defendant for non-suit was taken under advisement.

State of Oregon vs Charles Smith; on motion of prosecuting attorney, the same was dismissed.

State vs Al Richardson; on motion of the prosecuting attorney the cause was dismissed.

State vs Fred Hemmeler; on motion of the prosecuting attorney, the cause was dismissed.

State vs F C Perry; defendant having paid the costs in two charges, on motion of the prosecuting attorney the same were dismissed.

Abraham Lewis vs Simon Gotlieb, P Brenner and R Brenner; motion of defendants to set aside judgment denied.

Charles Risley, trustee of estate of Henry Nass vs W T Burney, et al; sheriff's sale confirmed.

Emile Clagnet vs Joseph Hobenlauer, et al; sheriff's sale confirmed.

The following court expenses were ordered paid. W. N. Barrett, district attorney, \$125; C. E. Runyan, court reporter, \$80; T. W. Fouts, bailiff, \$45; Thomas M. Miller, bailiff, \$48.

Court adjourned Friday for the term, but Judge McBride will hold short terms occasionally to hear motions.

Chautauqua Notes.

The grangers have taken 1000 tickets for Grange day, July 8.

The great and burning question now is how to feed the people. Restaurant propositions are under consideration.

On account of the great number of applications for camping spaces that have come in, it has been decided to arrange the grounds as systematically as the positions of the trees will admit.

Dr. Carlos Martyn of Chicago, who speaks on the opening day of the Chautauqua assembly, is already on his way to the coast. Last week he spoke every night in Spokane to crowded houses.

The board of directors met Saturday evening to consider a proposition from the Portland General Electric Light company for lighting the assembly grounds.

A committee consisting of Col. Miller, C. H. Canfield and James Steel was appointed to make arrangements for permanently lighting the grounds.

Professor Boyer and Rose Bloch sang in "The Creation" at Salem last week. The university at Salem has made inducements to Professor Heritage so that he will remain there.

He expects to have a music tent on the Chautauqua ground with three pianos. He thinks 75 of his singers will assist in the opening concert of the Chautauqua, July 7.
