The question as to who are qualified voters at the presidential election next Tuesday is of interest to every person. prices. The constitution of the state provides: That every male citizen of the at the Racket Store. United States of the age of 21 years and upwards, who shall have resided in this state during the six months immediately preceding such election, and every

foreign born'male who shall have resided in the state six months and declared his intention to become a citizen one entitled to vote at all elections." Voters can vote in any precinct in the state for president, If a man lives in Portland and has business in Oregon City or any other place within the state on election day he is entitled to the right to vote. He must be a resident of the state six months. No time of residence is required in the county, A foreigner does not have to have his full papers to vote. If he he has taken out his first papers one year prior to November 3, 1896, he is entitled to vote.
