AT THE INSANE ASYLUM.—Owing to the over crowded condition of the insane asylum at Salem the board of trustees, through Supt. Paine has notified the county judges throughout the state that persons addicted to the morphia habit will be promptly discharged, where it does not appear that insanity accompanies the habit. ...

IN NEW ENGLAND.—The many friends of Rev. Roland D. Grant in Oregon City will be pleased to learn that he has lost none of the old time enthusiasm since going East and that he is still moving large audiences in Concord, N. H. At a recent Christian Endeavor convention held in Hartford, where there were some 900 delegates and where the governor of the state and Dr. Wayland Hoyt, of Philadelphia, participated, Dr. Grant made an eloquent address, in which, among other things, he said the "largest Christian Endeavor society in the world is in a city in Oregon." ...

CALL FOR WARRANTS.—City Treasurer H. E. Straight has given notice that he has funds to pay off all Oregon City warrants endorsed prior to December, 10, 1894. Interest ceases on such warrants after November 11, 1896. There has been no call for Clackamas county warrants made since September 24, when County Treasurer Shade called in all warrants endorsed prior to August 15, 1893. ...

FOR FORGERY.—Joseph Richardson, of this city, was arrested Sunday morning by Chief of Police Burns, on a warrant charging him with forgery committed at Salem on the Friday preceding. He purchased a suit of clothes and some other things at the New York racket store, tendering in payment a twenty dollar check on his uncle, F. Robertson, of Turner. Chief Dille came down from Salem Monday and took the culprit to that city, where he was tried before Judge Eades and bound over to await the action of the grand jury. ...

A CITIZENS' TAXPAYERS' CONVENTION.—There will be a mass convention of the citizens and taxpayers of Oregon City to be held at Weinhard's hall on Monday evening, November 23, for the purpose of nominating a candidate for mayor, two councilmen for the First ward and two councilmen for the Second ward and a city treasurer, to be voted for at the forthcoming municipal election to be held in Oregon City on December 7, 1896. ...

Feeding an Acre of Corn.

It being a disputed question as to whether corn can be made a paying crop for Willamette Valley farmers, the State Agricultural college of Corvallis has undertaken to demonstrate that it is one of our most profitable crops when rightly handled. The following is one of the experiments that has been carried on this fall under the direction of Prof. H. T. French. ...

Eight pigs, weighing 1445 lbs. when taken off the stubble, were placed in a pen, with yard attached, September 16, and the feeding began. The corn which was just beyond the roasting stage, was snapped off, weighed, and thrown to pigs without husking. The husks were green and offered little hindrance to the pigs in getting the corn. ...

The corn matured more thoroughly it was husked before feeding. In 28 days the pigs consumed 5305 pounds of corn, the yield from four-fifths of an acre of ground. The pigs gained in live weight during the 28 days 423 pounds, or 52.7 pounds each. At 2 1/2 cents per pound live weight, the current price for hogs on foot would amount to \$10.55 or the gross returns from the four-fifths of an acre of corn. The cost of growing an acre of corn and feeding to pigs is reckoned as follows: ...

Plowing ground, \$1.25; Harrowing and marking, 1.00; Seed corn, .25; Planting corn, .50; Picking and husking, .20; 6 months interest at 8 percent on land valued at \$30 per acre, \$1.30; Total, \$5.50. Four-fifths of \$5.50, or \$6.80, would represent the cost of producing the corn consumed in 28 days. ...
